SANDBAGGERS VS TIN CUPS 5 : 5

Once the team pairings have been posted on the starting sheet then the only change will be if a playing group agree that someone's handicap is incorrect. If this is agreed then the scorecard will be adjusted and when this is handed to the committee at the end of the round the fact will be highlighted of a changed handicap.

The league has always worked on 'fair play' and 'honesty' of the golfers and this will remain as the principal criteria.
