RULES, QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS

The Rules question mentioned earlier occurred on Hole #16. A players ball came to rest very close to, and such that the stance was seriously impeded by, the cart path in front of the lateral water hazard. The ball had not crossed the hazard and was not touching the cart path wall [i.e. the hazard]. Players discussed whether this path was a movable [ha ha] or immovable or integral part of the course.

JGCC has determined that cart paths are immovable obstructions and that Rule 24-2 applies. In this instance the player should have been given relief.

Rule 24-2

Except when the ball is in a water hazard, relief without penalty is available from immovable obstructions and abnormal ground conditions when the condition physically interferes with the lie of the ball, your stance or your swing. You may lift the ball and drop it within one club-length of the nearest point of relief (see Definition of "Nearest Point of Relief"), but not nearer the hole than the nearest point of relief.

Unlike stakes defining Out of Bounds, Water Hazard stakes are obstructions, and can therefore be removed by the player without penalty. Interesting to also note that as a Hazard line is itself in the Hazard, if any part of the ball touches any part of the line the ball lies in the hazard.

Should situations arise where there is doubt on the correctly Rule interpretation then the player [after consulting and agreeing with the other players] plays two balls. One from where the ball is and one from where relief may be taken. Record both scores and then ask for a decision when you arrive at the Club from a Committee member.
